



The first day of Term 2, 2019 will be exciting for the students, teachers and parents at Hurlstone Agricultural High School.

What to expect

Our new learning spaces and facilities will be ready and open for students for Day 1 Term 2, 2019 including:

- five new modern science laboratories
- modern technology and applied studies (TAS) facilities including new innovative food & textiles, and wood & metal learning spaces
- new and refurbished visual arts learning spaces
- new combined food technology and textile learning spaces
- a new central learning commons courtyard space.

The new modern facilities contain flexible and innovative, technology-rich teaching spaces which will create dynamic learning experiences for students and encourage collaboration.

Remaining works

Some minor finishing works will continue until June 2019 with minimal disruption to school operations. This includes equipment rooms for Block I and the science building, as well as paving and landscaping works. Temporary fencing and shade cloth will be installed to separate the work area from the school and ensure the safety of staff and students.
